VFSN is a parent led, volunteer based Incorporated Association providing peer support, parent information and community inclusion opportunities to the Vietnamese Community living with disability in Western Melbourne.

Established in 2003 to enhance the emotional and social wellbeing of Vietnamese families, the VFSN today provides support to families in Melbourne's west and to the wider community. Our programs build skills, connection, cultural understanding and wellbeing.

The VFSN is led by a Committee of Management all of whom are parents of a child with a disability. We operate according to the Model Rules for an Incorporated Association and Victoria Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

Our Vision and Mission

Our vision is to live in a community where Vietnamese families who have a child or family member with a disability live with respect and dignity. We believe everyone has a right to reach their optimum wellbeing and capacity; are understood and accepted without judgement and stigma.

Our mission is to help families we support to feel connected, hopeful, empowered and resourced. Our programs aim is to help children, parents and carers reach their potential, participate fully in the community and live better, easier and happier lives

Our Programs

Weekly Parent Support Group

We offer a weekly Parent Peer Support Group that aims to enhance the emotional and social wellbeing of Vietnamese parents of children with a disability, reduce isolation and strengthen parenting capacity. Families receive guidance, advice and education about caring for a child with a disability and information on how to access the disability service system. The Group also provides regular carer well-being sessions and facilitated opportunities for parents to experience and learn how to manage stress, eat well, exercise and relax.
